# ROAD TO SCHOOL

The Road to School (RTS) program aims to build a strong foundation and bridge learning gaps for grades 1-8 students through various interventions, such as developing foundational literacy and numeracy, promoting hygiene and wellness, building physical fitness through sports, unleashing creativity through arts activities, and encouraging continued education. This integrated approach continues to foster holistic development since 2015, equipping government school students and underserved communities with the tools to thrive in life.

## Key Focus Areas



### Academics

Students strengthen their understanding of foundational literacy and numeracy through innovative pedagogy and customized lesson plans based on individual learning levels. Additionally, selected students are prepared for scholarship and competitive exams that can enhance their academic prospects.



### Wellness

Students, teachers, parents and the community learn about wellness for themselves, society, and the planet. Wellness practices are inculcated through sessions in the school and awareness drives in the community.



### Sports

Students develop their motor skills, learn about their bodies, and enhance their kinesthetic intelligence through activities and participation in games and sports competitions at the school, district, and national levels.



### Arts

Students enhance their creativity through art activities conducted using available material in the school which in turn increases their self-confidence, critical thinking and self-expression.

# ROAD TO LIVELIHOOD

The Road to Livelihood (RTL) program builds on the Road to School initiative to support high school students in navigating life beyond middle school. It equips them with essential skills in digital literacy, communication, wellness, and career planning, enabling informed choices for higher education, vocational training, or employment. RTL fosters real-world readiness, guiding students toward better lives.



## Career Guidance

Students undertake psychometric assessments and receive guidance from certified mentors to explore and consider career pathways aligned with their interests, aptitude, and aspirations.



## Adolescent Wellness

This vertical focuses on fostering well-being and emotional resilience, helping students manage the challenges of adolescence and grow into confident, capable individuals.



## Digital Literacy

The sessions on digital literacy equip students with the necessary Information and Communication Technology (ICT) skills in MS Office and internet applications required in today's professional world, enhancing their employability and paving the way for a successful livelihood



## Financial Literacy

Helping students understand key financial concepts and develop the skills needed to manage resources and plan for the future.





## Soft Skills

Equipping students with communication, leadership, and critical thinking skills to navigate academic and professional environments effectively.

The Road to School program is built on the understanding that a child's success in life depends on the world around them. That is why its approach goes beyond the classroom and focuses on strengthening all parts of a child's ecosystem.

**Empowered Teachers + Supportive School Leaders + Engaged Communities + Active Government Support = Holistic Development of Students**

- Teachers are mentored to create engaging and inclusive classrooms.
- School leaders are supported to lead academic change.
- Local education departments are engaged as key partners, enabling alignment, ownership, and long-term sustainability.
- Communities are mobilised to take ownership of learning.



## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Community development under the Road to School program extends far beyond the school gates. While it is anchored in children's learning, its impact reaches across families, youth, and underserved individuals to build more informed, resilient, and self-reliant communities.

### Parent Counselling and Student Re-enrolment

Field teams work with families to promote positive parenting and ensure children return to and stay in school.

### Youth Engagement

Local youth are trained as community motivators, helping shift attitudes towards education and aspiration.

### Awareness and Access

Community members are supported in accessing government schemes, including entitlements for persons with disabilities, health services, and livelihood benefits.

### Livelihood and Skill Development

Women and youth are linked to skill training and job opportunities to strengthen financial independence.

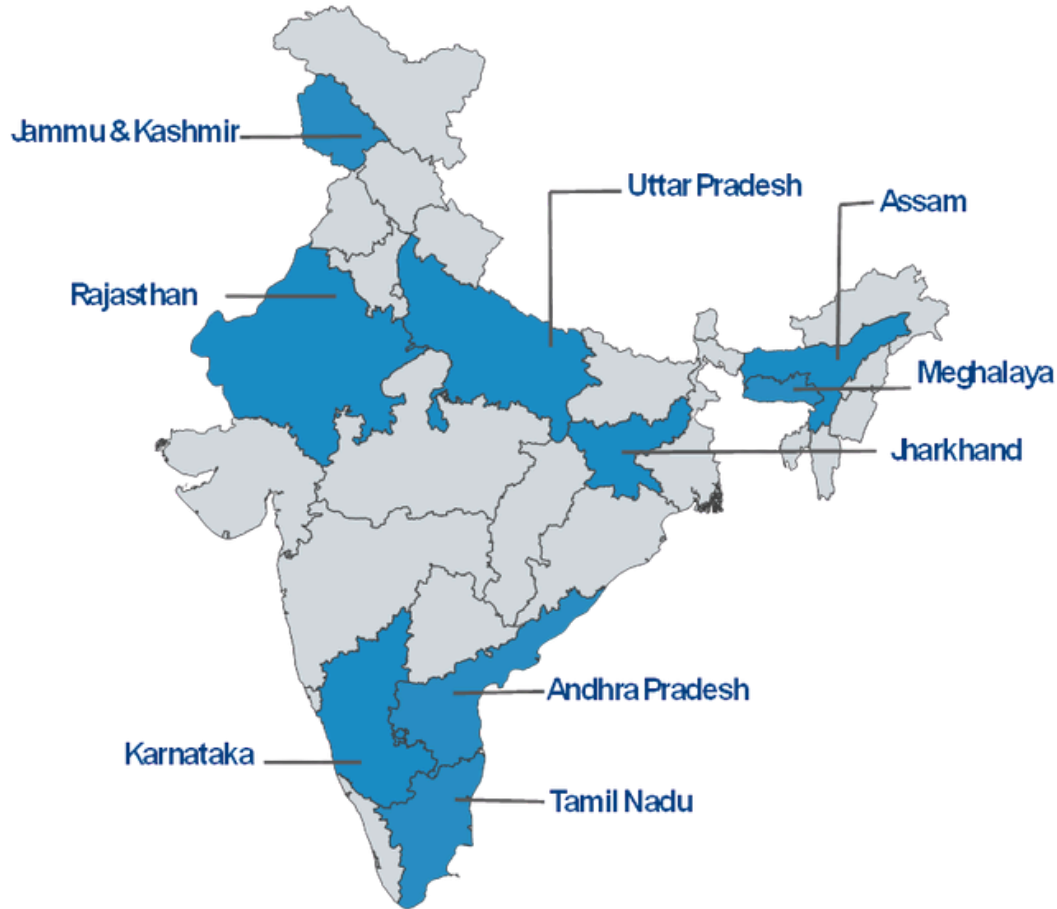
### Health and Well-being

The program organizes health camps based on local needs—from anemia screening and eye check-ups to hygiene awareness and support around violence, sanitation, and climate concerns.

## HEALTH & WELLNESS



**Mobile Medical Units (MMUs)**  
A fleet of **13 Mobile Medical Units** operates across different states, delivering basic healthcare to remote villages, including those with large driver populations. These MMUs have offered regular screening services for hypertension, vision issues, diabetes, and other common health concerns to **over 4 lakh beneficiaries till date.**

### Supporting Children with Type 1 Diabetes

Type 1 Diabetes is a form of diabetes in children. In this lifelong condition, the body produces little or no insulin, requiring daily management. Since FY19, ALF has supported over **3,700 children** from economically disadvantaged backgrounds by collaborating with **prestigious hospitals** to ensure continuous access to medication and consultations.



## SUSTAINABILITY



**Water Management Initiatives**  
In water-scarce regions of Alwar and Nainital, ALF has introduced innovative solutions such as spring-shed development, rooftop rainwater harvesting, and solar-powered water lifting systems to improve water management. These efforts have reached over **60,000 beneficiaries** in FY 2026-27.

### Tree Plantation Drive

As part of its environmental efforts, ALF has planted over **1 lakh trees** through tree plantation drives to support ecological restoration and improve green cover. In addition, under its flagship program Road to School, ALF has facilitated the plantation of **85,000+ trees** across various regions of the country.
