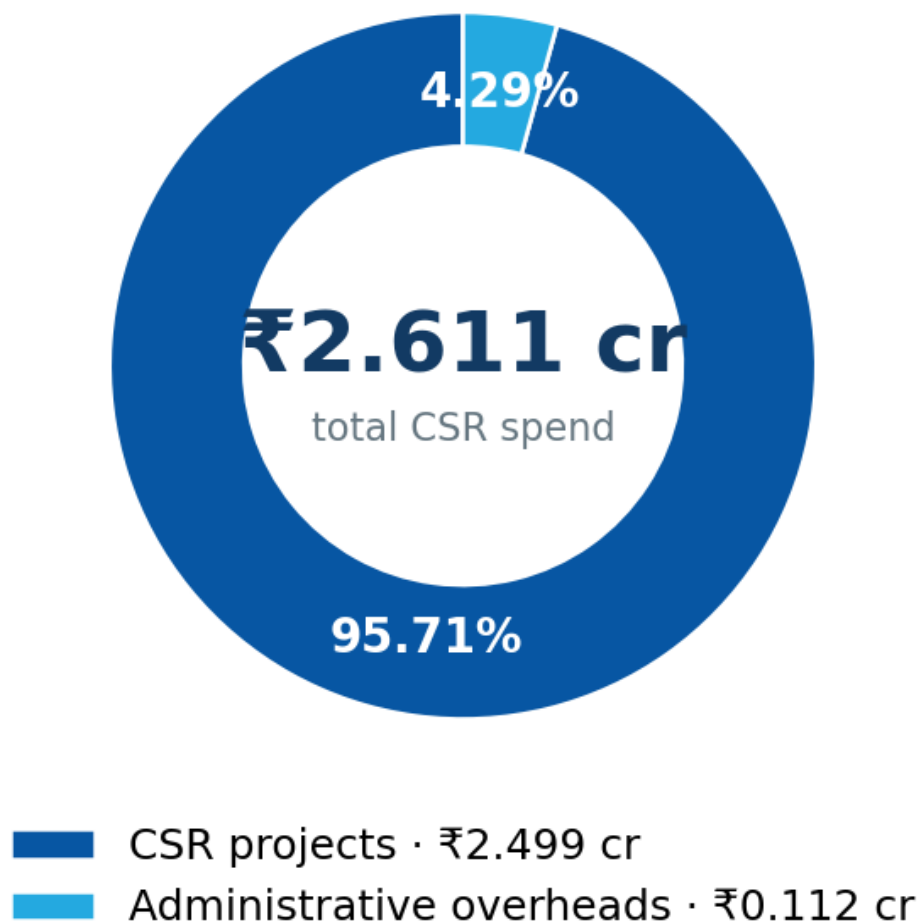
Editorial assessment

FY 2025-26 CSR spending allocation



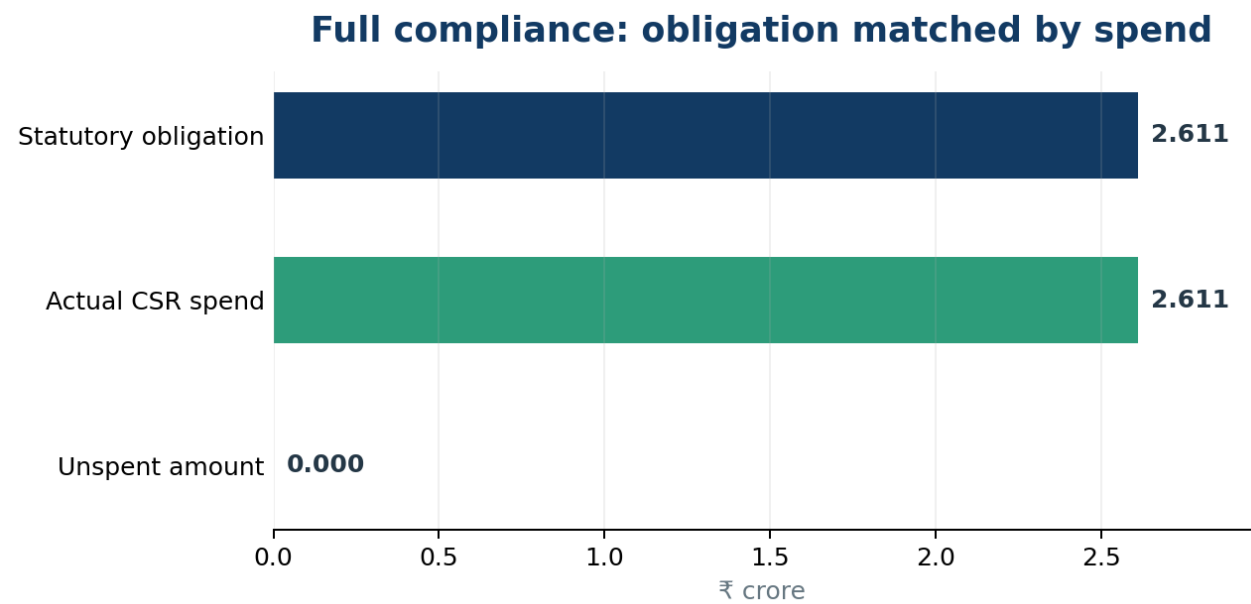

1. Eco School Project

Launched in FY24, the Eco School Project strengthens water, sanitation and hygiene infrastructure in government schools in Dehradun and Bengaluru. It uses targeted, need-based interventions to create safer, more hygienic and inclusive learning environments.

- Reported coverage: more than 27 schools to date.
- Core interventions: improved sanitation facilities, clean-water access and hygiene infrastructure.
- Target groups: students and teaching staff in government schools.
- Implementation: in partnership with an external organisation working in WASH and education across India; the annual report does not name that organisation.

2. ASPIRE Scholarship Program

Launched in June 2025, ASPIRE provides financial assistance to meritorious children of Eureka Forbes service technicians, from kindergarten through graduation. Eligible students receive reimbursement support for tuition fees and related educational expenses.

- Purpose: educational empowerment and inclusive growth within communities connected to the company's service ecosystem.
- Implementation partners named by the company: Samhita and Scholarlify.
- Reported support mechanism: reimbursement of tuition fees and related educational expenses.

What changed on the ground

Testimonials reproduced in the annual report point to cleaner and separate toilets, reduced queues and water-related disruption, improved hygiene and discipline, and greater comfort for students. A teacher also highlighted the value of a monthly operations and maintenance budget for sustaining hygienic conditions.

Impact interpretation

- The company reports output and reach indicators, especially schools and beneficiaries.
- The programme logic links WASH infrastructure to attendance conditions, dignity, comfort and healthier school environments.
- No statutory impact assessment was applicable for FY26, and no impact-assessment expenditure was reported.
- The disclosed information does not provide a project-wise spend split, gender-disaggregated beneficiary data, outcome baselines or independently evaluated learning and health outcomes.
